



Happy New Year Everyone!!!

Praying that you all had a blessed and merry Christmas and that this finds you all - ready for the start of a New Year! After being with family and friends over the past two to four weeks you may have picked up a few germs and became sick. There is so much crud going around, and it seems like very few people are escaping it. Those viruses are so contagious!

Remember when we were kids how our mom used to tell us that we could catch a cold if we went outside without our coats and hats and got too cold or especially if we got our heads wet? Truth is, germs, not cold weather, cause colds. The reason we catch more colds in the cold winter weather is because we're indoors more and in closer quarters with other people and their germs.

You don't get sick from cold weather. You get sick from germs from other people who sneeze or cough in your face or transmit germs with their hands to objects that you touch. Research shows that the most common way to get a cold is from someone who has a cold, sneezes on their hands, and then shakes yours. Germs are *contagious*. Germs are the agents that transmit colds and viruses. Now why do I bring this up?

Because - when I return from vacation we will be beginning a new series called "Be Contagious!"

But not in the germy, virus way 😉

In this series we'll be talking about spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ; about sharing the joy we have in Christ by intentionally *coming in contact* with those who are seeking and searching for the Good News and wanting to follow Jesus.

One of our major purposes as Christ followers is to infect others with the love of God that we have in our hearts and lives. We should want to influence others in positive ways that make them want to know Christ. *We want to transmit God's love to their lives so that they too can enjoy knowing God.*

A church is considered evangelistically effective if just 1 person in 20 in that church leads a person to Christ each year. That would mean that a church of 100 people would see five people come to Christ in their ministry in one year if they were evangelistically effective. Based on this theory, only 3.5% of U.S. churches are evangelistically effective.

So, what makes a church contagious?

What makes them evangelistically effective?

What makes a church one of the "3 and a half out of one hundred?"

We are going to be looking at the early chapters of the New Testament letter to the church at Ephesus to answer this question. I will be using Paul's letter because God communicated some things through Paul to the Ephesian church that they needed to hear that will make them more contagious. Basically, they needed to be reminded how rich they were in Christ. That's the theme to the Ephesian church letter - how rich Christ followers are, having made the decision to commit their lives to Jesus.

When you want to be reminded of how rich you are in Christ, the Book of Ephesians is one of the places in the Bible that you can turn to. What does knowing how rich we are in Christ have to do with being contagious?

A lot of times, when you think you are poor; you become convinced that you don't have anything to offer anyone else. You become pessimistic instead of optimistic. And when you're pessimistic you are not contagious. No one in his or her right mind wants to "catch" pessimism. But if you have something that makes you optimistic - others will want what you have. You will be contagious! If you are a Christ follower - you have great things to be optimistic about!

From time to time, we need to reflect on how very rich we are in Christ, not only for our own benefit but also so we can bless others with enthusiasm for life.

God wants you to know how much you have to give - especially spiritually speaking.

No one is richer than the person who has experienced God's grace is! No one has more to offer!

How can we become more *contagious*, more effective at sharing the Good News of Jesus to others? It begins with seeing how very much we have to offer because of our position in Christ!

So, on January 19, we are going to start learning how to be more contagious by considering "Germs That Make Us Contagious" – in a spiritually good way.

I look forward to seeing everyone in 2025 when I return from vacation.



Jesse and Kim Vander Plaats and his big sister Kobi.



- All bills and apportionments are paid to date.
- Turkey Dinner results: Income: \$13,280.00 Expenses: \$7029.30 Profit: \$6250.61. 10% will be donated to Relay for Life and remainder to be used by Trustees.
- Kozlowski estimate for annual workman's comp for Pastor Velda was \$406 per year. Chuck Vaux motioned to accept this estimate, seconded by Joan Walker. Motion passed unanimously.
- Discussion on automatic donations through Vanco. Vanco has increased their fees considerably. - Discussion on contracting accounting services through Kinner and Company to handle payroll, expenses, etc. Motion to approve this was made by Valerie Klumper and seconded by Jan Wussow. Jennifer Nordmeyer from Kinner and Company will be added as a signer on the church checking account.
- Kwik Trip has contacted the Church about creating an account and the benefits that it would provide. Motion was made by Chuck Vaux to approve this account and second by Shelley Wiese.
