The Missions Committee is Making BIG Plans and They Include You!

The Mission Committee convened after church in December, and we have some exciting plans for the upcoming year, including a community project right here in Pipestone. We have decided to paint a house in the southeast part of town for a woman facing challenges in

affording home improvements. Some minor repairs will be completed beforehand, but the painting will be done on **Saturday, May 17th**. So please mark your calendars as the Peace UMC members extend Christ's love to our neighbors. Our theme will be, "The church has left the building!"

Additionally, we discussed organizing an overnight mission trip. This year, we're focusing on something closer to home by partnering with Solar Oven Partners, a mission ministry of the Dakotas Conference of the United Methodist Church. We plan to travel to Raymond, SD, for two days and one night to construct solar ovens, which will be shipped to locations in Africa, the Dominican Republic, or the Navajo Nation in Arizona. While we don't have exact dates yet, it will be scheduled for the latter half of September. There is camping space available, and several Peace Mission members have expressed interest in this option. The center in Raymond also offers a small "Hostel" with beds, a bathroom, and a kitchen for those without campers. Another idea discussed at the meeting is a trip in 2026 to Midwest Missions in Pawnee, IL, where we would work for several days and nights. The Peace Quilters are actively sewing each month for this mission, making it a wonderful opportunity to engage more deeply in our support.

Are you thinking, "I'm no longer able to paint a house, that is too physical for me?" That is ok! Can we count on your financial help? Or how about helping with lunch or snacks for the workers? We need you, you are valuable to our mission, so we hope to see our whole church on Saturday, May 17th. Fun fact: Did you know that there are over 2,000 verses in the Bible urging us to assist the poor? James 2:17 reminds us that faith without action is dead. Church, let's roll up our sleeves and get to work, for this church is truly ALIVE!

Your name will be added to the volunteer worksheet that is on the cupboard doors in the fireside room. You can then write your volunteer hours on that worksheet by the end of each month & the hours will be tabulated & sent to ACE. (You can also let Elly know your hours.) We are hoping members will complete the form so that funding can be received for the volunteer activities you already do!
